Fortunately, I found one organization which is in the right track of my long time dream and I tried my best to have a successful connection with this inspiring organization and wanted to do my volunteering through their assistance and guidance.

## My Name is Haile Kiflai

I was born in the late 1960s in Asmara, Eritrea. My family was poor, and unfortunately, the lack of access to medication and early immunization resulted in me losing my sight due to measles. It was a difficult time, and many children, including my younger sister, were dying from preventable diseases.

At the age of 12, I started attending the AbraHa Bahta School for the Blind, where I began my journey towards education and personal growth. After completing my undergraduate degree in language and literature at Asmara University, I became the first General Manager of the Eritrean National Association of the Blind.

Unfortunately, political turmoil in my homeland forced me to flee to Canada as a refugee. It was a challenging time, but I remained determined to pursue my dreams. I volunteered at the CNIB to gain Canadian work experience and was eventually offered an internship at BMO Bank of Montreal Online Banking in 2003, where I have been serving in various roles ever since.

Beyond my professional career, I have also been an active member of my community. I served as a board member for BALANCE, a blind organization for adults in Toronto, and the Eritrean Canadian Community Center. I have also been a vocal advocate for the rights of Eritreans living under the country's dictatorial regime.


My story is a testament to the power of determination and resilience in the face of adversity. Despite the challenges I have faced, I have continued to pursue my dreams and make a positive impact in my community.
